For BRC members ONLY.

1 horse/1 rider. No stallions. Hoof boots welcome.

Green Horse Day Out - Start the New Year by bringing your new/young/green horse (or your rusty self) out in a safe environment. Someone will be there supporting you to get on, if necessary, canter in a fenced arena or introduce scary objects like carrying a jacket.

Come for 15 minutes or spend hours on your horse progressing at your own pace. Heather will have the Sand Arena near the yards set up with simple and safe activities. \$10

Poles & Grids - Clinton van der Sanden will be on hand to help you with your style, your line and your timing using poles and grids. There will be a Caprilli test in the Classic, so this will be a great opportunity to practice looking good over fences. Group lessons with 4 riders. \$45

Dressage Protocol - Claire Harper and Susan Marbrow will be on hand to give you feedback and assistance while practicing the new 2019 EA tests, just in time for the Classic. You can choose which test you would like to ride (maximum of two tests), so why not go up a level from your usual comfort zone without the stress of competition? \$25
